## PREMIUM CHECKS

1. Exhibitors awarded over \$599.00 must produce a valid, signed W-9 to be awarded premium (prize) monies.

2. Flower premium checks will be dispersed to exhibitors on the Pick-Up Day (Monday) following close of the fair or no later than thirty (30) days after close of the Fair.
3. Unclaimed premium checks will be mailed.
4. Premium checks not cashed in ninety (90) days of issue date become void and will not be reissued.
5. Lost or stolen premium checks will not be reissued past sixty (60) days of original issue date.
6. No claim that a premium(s) has not been paid, or that there was a discrepancy in payment of the premium(s) won, will be considered when claim is made later than November 30 following the Fair.

## RULES and REGULATIONS

The South Carolina State Fair [General Rules and Regulations](#) shall apply.

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Exhibitor must be a resident of South Carolina and entries must have been grown by the exhibitor in South Carolina.

## ENTRY REGISTRATION

- Entry Registration is required during the Open or Late Entry Registration Period. Register by the preferred method by using the [Online Entry System](#) or one may also register using a current South Carolina State Fair Official Flower entry form.
- Deliver completed form via Postal Mail to: **SC State Fair, Entry Office, P. O. Box 393, Columbia SC 29202.**
- One may also hand deliver a completed entry form Monday - Friday during regular office hours between 7:30 am and 4:00 pm to: **Dowling Administration Building, 1200 Rosewood Drive, Columbia SC 29201.**
- Entry registration forms must be received by the closing date in the Entry Office during business hours.
- Entry registration forms received during late registration must be accompanied by the \$25 Late Fee.
- Incomplete entry forms will not be processed.

## ENTRY REGISTRATION CONFIRMATION

- Online entry registrations are automatically confirmed by return email at time of submission.
- Please print and bring your confirmation on Delivery Day.
- Exhibitors who postal mail their entry registrations and desire a confirmation must include a self-addressed and stamped business size envelope.
- Please do not telephone the Fair or Entry Office for confirmation.

## LATE ENTRY REGISTRATIONS

- Entry registration forms received during Late Registration Period must be accompanied by the \$25 Late Fee.
- Late Fees may be charged to a credit/debit card (MasterCard or Visa) or money order.
- Checks will not be accepted during the Late Entry Registration Period.

## LIMITATIONS

- Exhibitor may register one (1) entry per class.
- Exhibitors may enter in any or all divisions, but no exhibit may be entered more than once.

- All entries not in accordance with the schedule will be disqualified.

#### RESTRICTIONS

- Spanish moss, nor any other highly flammable substance, is not allowed in any building on the fairgrounds.
- No hanging baskets.

#### JUDGING

- No person will be allowed in the show area during judging except the specified committee.

#### CARE OF EXHIBITS DURING FAIR

- The Flower Superintendent and Show Committee reserves the right to maintain all exhibits in show condition.
- If an exhibit deteriorates to where it detracts from the entire exhibit, it will be removed from the exhibition area.

#### RELEASE OF EXHIBITS

- The SC State Fair and the Show Committee will not be responsible for exhibits or ribbons left after the scheduled release date and time (see Important Dates).
- Unclaimed exhibits and any other items will become the property of the SC State Fair and will be either disposed of or donated to charity.

#### POTTED PLANT RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All entries must be grown by the exhibitor and entered in grower's name only.
2. Only one (1) entry allowed per class. Duplicate entries will be disqualified.
3. Only one (1) plant allowed to a pot unless specified in the schedule.
4. Exhibitor must provide a drip saucer for each plant entered.
5. Due to limited space, there is a maximum of twenty-five (25) entries per person in Potted Plant Division.
6. Due to space and for ease of handling, potted plants must be in pots not exceeding sixteen (16) inches from outside lip to outside lip across the top. **Pots over sixteen (16) inches will not be accepted.** Plants must have been in exhibitor's possession at least sixty (60) days prior to show.
7. NOT PERMITTED:
  - a. Disposable nursery pots
  - b. Hanging baskets
  - c. Leaf Shine
  - d. Spanish moss
8. Plants must be free of insects, disease and spray residue. Potted plants in straw or ornamental containers are discouraged. A potted plant does not mean a hanging basket with wires removed. Foliage plants means grown for their foliage and not flowering plants without blooms.
9. An Award of Merit and premium will be given in the Potted Plant Section, only if warranted. To be eligible, entry must be a blue ribbon winner, scoring 95 or over and named correctly. Plants having won Award of Merit previously are not eligible to win a second time.

10. Entries will be accepted only for classes offered in the **Exhibit Guide.**

#### CUT HORTICULTURE RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Cut Horticulture is divided into five (5) sections: **Annuals, Dahlias, Perennials, Shrubs, Trees.**
2. Horticulture specimens must be properly named. If class is not listed on the schedule, entry will not be accepted.
3. Containers will be furnished for all cut entries.
4. Exhibitor may use plastic wrap for wedging specimens.
5. When the number of varieties of specimens in a class is stated, an exhibit of greater or lesser number will be disqualified.
6. Classes marked "Any Other" means there must be two (2) or more plant specimens to name the class.
7. Cut horticulture specimens will not be returned.
8. All specimen flowers must be grown by the exhibitor and entered in grower's name only.
9. LIMITATIONS:
  - a. Entries are limited to thirty-five (35) entries per exhibitor in Cut Horticulture Division.
  - b. Entries are limited to one (1) entry per class, per exhibitor.
